#### For your Summer Assignment

The goal here is for you to closely examine the content of the passages before we actually read them in Latin. In the fall we will explore the ways in which our understanding of the text deepens when the syllabus is read in Latin.

After choosing a translation (<u>click here for some suggestions</u>), read each selection noted in this journal and choose quotations significant and interesting to you, in English, from the text. Write a thoughtful analysis which includes your honest reaction as you read. This packet contains 15 response pages, all of which must be completed before the first day of school.

we will also lay out curricular themes inherent in the text. These curricular themes will form the basis for further discussion about our readings.
