## **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

The Earth is a dynamic planet! Hurricanes, earthquakes, floods, tsunamis ... What causes these natural disasters? Are they getting worse? ## **GRADING**

Cumulative / In-Progress Grade:

- 10% of the grade will be based on formative assessments, homework completion, or behavior (see FPS BOE Policy 6154AR)
- 90% will be based on summative assessments based on a minimum of four assessments (see FPS BOE Policy 6146AR)

#### End of Semester Grade

- 90% will reflect the student's cumulative course grade through summative and formative assessments as described above.
- 10% of the end-of-the-course grade will reflect the student's performance on the course final assessment.

#### Grade Reporting

- All grades will be communicated through Infinite Campus
- Summative assessment results will be reported back to the student within ten school days from the date of submission
  or the due date.
