Good afternoon RLA elementary families and happy last day of March! Several years ago, the Fairfield Public Schools recognized the need to provide a program to empower children with the necessary skills to avert dangerous or abusive situations. <u>The Talking About Touching</u> program helps children recognize potential trouble, act assertively to rebuff it, and take necessary safety steps if it occurs.

Again this year, children in kindergarten through second grade will have lessons focused on saying NO, getting away, and telling a trusted adult. Mrs. Lori Mediate, the Health Coordinator for the Fairfield Public Schools, will be delivering these lessons at the kindergarten level. The information will be reviewed in grades 1 and 2 by the classroom teacher. The lessons are designed to empower children with skills and information needed for personal protection.

This is not a task for the schools alone. We must work together. Most children are tricked or manipulated – not forced – into sexually abusive activity. The following tips are provided for parents to work with children so that we can reinforce each other's teaching:

- Talk to your children every day and take time to really listen and observe.
- Learn as many details as you can about your children's attitudes and feelings.
- Encourage your children to share concerns or problems with you.
- Explain that each child's body belongs to that child alone and each child has the right to say NO to anyone who might try to touch inappropriately.
- Try not to scare your children, but emphasize it is not only strangers who might ask them to do something that makes them feel uncomfortable or scared.
- Develop your children's support systems. Help them identify people who could help them (parent/s, relatives, teachers, friends, clergyperson, or counselor).
- Review the "Touching Rule": no one touches the private parts of your body except to keep you healthy.

Remember, not giving children information leaves them vulnerable. Providing information in a sensitive and non-threatening manner permits them the rights they deserve.
